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The Association Supports the Approval of Tofersen

- The Association support since at least 2004 over multiple grants
- We do not take a position on FDA approval for any drug until we conduct a review with independent experts



The Association Supports the Approval of Tofersen

- Tofersen failed its primary endpoints, and it appears the trial was not long enough to detect a clinical change
- Tofersen has a clear biological effect after 3-4 months of treatment, with clinical change occurring months later
- After a year of study, people who got the drug six months earlier do appear to be declining at a much slower rate



The Association Supports the Approval of Tofersen

We recommend accelerated approval because

- Strong biological effect
- Link between the biological effect and clinical effect
- The devastating nature of ALS and the challenges of ultra rare research
- An ongoing study, expected to complete in 2027, is the fastest way to meet the requirements for accelerated approval
