



Your comments could answer one or more of the following the questions on why this DOT proposed rule is needed for people living with ALS:


- Has your wheelchair ever been lost or damaged while traveling?

- Have you ever been in a situation where airline employees needed additional training for assisting a person living with ALS or their battery-powered assistive devices?


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



